

PROCRASTINATING QUILTERS BOM 2012

Part 1: Center block and first 2 borders

This quilt will be constructed in 6 parts. The first part consists of the center block (finishing at 20"/20 ½ " unfinished), first pieced border, and second border.

Since this is a scrappy quilt, we will not be providing yardage estimates. The quilt will finish at approx. 58" square, and will have a medallion appearance.

Choices for center block:

Applique:

A 20" block pattern is provided; please feel free to amend the shapes, add some of your favorite things, or leave out some elements altogether. This can be done by hand or machine, whatever your personal preference.

Piecing:

Any combination of piecing resulting in a 20" finished block is possible. A pattern for 10 " finished Queen Charlotte's Crown is provided. 4 Blocks will be required to make the center if you use this pattern.

Some other suggestions:

A checkerboard – any variation that results in 20" finished, for example: 4 rows of 4 x 5 ½ squares (16 pieces), 5 rows of 5 x 4 ½ " squares (25 pieces) – you get the idea – for the really ambitious among you, you could do a 100 patch – 10 rows of 10 2 ½ inch squares.

A single piece of a big print that you don't want to cut up – 20 ½ inch unfinished.

An orphan appliqué or pieced block that you can make fit the dimension – it's ok to add a "coping" strip to make it 20 ½ " square.

A panel that you can make fit 20 ½ ", or add border strips to make it fit.
