

## TUMBLER BLOCKS from Quilter's Cache.com

This is another of those odd patterns that in reality doesn't really make a block, although it certainly COULD, with the addition of triangles at the edges, as I have shown here, just so I could draw it square... :o)

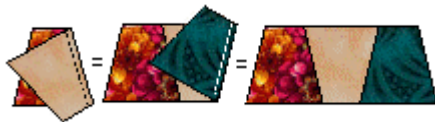

### **\*\* Preparing the Pieces and Sewing the Block \*\***

Print off the template (s) provided, then transfer them to your favorite template material, add 1/4" all around, and begin to cut tumblers from any variety of fabrics. This makes a WONDERFUL charm quilt, if done in all different fabrics...meaning...no repeats!



Begin sewing your tumblers together, right sides together along the side edges, using all SCANT 1/4" seams. This template makes tumblers 3" across at the bottom, 1-1/2" across at the top, and 3" tall. Using that as a rough guide, you can decide how many you would like per row to make the size quilt you desire...



Piece the rows, again using all SCANT 1/4" seams...

That's all there is to it!



I show this quilt only to give you an idea of how scrappy it will look. The measurements of a real quilt with as many pieces as this one has(272) would be about 39" wide by 48" long. Here, you see it with binding added to the sloped edges...
